RESEARCH GRANTS FOR DIABETES RESEARCH - 2005

Research proposals are invited from Indian scientists interested in conducting research in the field of diabetes mellitus for funding by RSSDI for the year 2005. These proposals may fall into one of the following two categories:

- Projects involving funding up to Rs.40,000 per project (Preference will be given to young scientists < 40 yrs)</p>
- Projects involving funding up to Rs.4 lakhs (preferably multicentric)

The proposal should include in brief the following:

- Title, names of principal and coinvestigators, introduction/background, review of literature, aims, methodology, study design and bibliography.
- Brief biodata of PI and other coinvestigators

- Brief mention of budget / proposed utilization of funding sought from RSSDI
- Whether the project is being partly funded from any other source? If yes source and amount.

Allocation of research grants would be done by July 2005 and hence all diabetes researchers seeking RSSDI grants should send in their proposals by June 30, 2005.
