LIFE MEMBERSHIP OF RSSDI

RSSDI is the largest Indian organization of diabetes health care professionals and researchers. In October 2003, 3050 life members are represented from 29 Indian States and Union Territories, and Nepal as follows: Andamans and Nicobar (2), Andhra Pradesh (502), Assam (65), Bihar (87), Jharkhand (27), Chandigarh (16), Delhi (133), Gujarat (135), Goa (9), Haryana (62), Himachal Pradesh (17), Jammu and Kashmir (12), Karnataka (253), Kerala (148), Manipur (8), Meghalaya (4), Mizoram (3), Madhya Pradesh (109), Chattisgarh (35), Maharashtra (380), Orissa (118), Pondicherry (5), Punjab (73), Rajasthan (126), Tamil Nadu (332), Tripura (9), Uttar Pradesh(232), Uttaranchal (8), West Bengal (136).

Important proceedings at Executive Committee Meeting and Annual General Meeting of the Research Society for the Study of Diabetes in India on October 9 and 11, 2003 in Jaipur

- a. **Following non compliance by Prof. R.J. Dash, it was decided to**
- 1. suspend RSSDI life membership of Prof. R.J. Dash for 3 months**
 - 2. announce his suspension in RSSDI NEWS and IJDDC**
 - 3. inform concerned auditors and bank in Chandigarh**
 - 4. initiate legal proceedings in this matter**
 - 5. seek the indulgence of the Director, P.G.I.M.E.R. and the RSSDI life members in Punjab, Haryana and Chandigarh to restore RSSDI funds.**
- b. Constitution for chapters was reviewed by President with following considerations.
1. The Chapters shall only be branches without independent registration as Societies;
 2. There shall be no conflict in the interest of the RSSDI and such chapters;
 3. The final and ultimate powers regarding any policy decision shall remain only with RSSDI and not Chapters;
 4. The Chapters shall propagate science, academics and research for the benefit of diabetes within specified jurisdiction;
 5. The Chapter Constitution shall be uniform for all such branches;
 6. Patrons, starting of institutions, courses, collaboration abroad etc. shall only be vested with the parent body and the parent body may delegate any chapter to implement the same. No Chapter on their own can undertake these activities;
- Draft constitution for state chapters of RSSDI was circulated to all RSSDI life members, discussed and approved in the AGM.
- c. Constitution amendment is as follows : Head Quarters of RSSDI may give 50% of unspent money deposited by the Organizing Committee of the annual scientific meeting of RSSDI to the respective state chapter as grant in aid for purpose of research and education.”
- d. There was only one valid nomination for the post of President of RSSDI for year 2004 by Dr. R.V. Jayakumar. His unanimous election to the post of President of RSSDI was approved.
- e. 63 life members from Kerala applied and were approved for starting Kerala Chapter of RSSDI.
64 life members from Karnataka applied and were approved for starting Karnataka Chapter of RSSDI.
- f. Income tax returns for RSSDI accounts between April 1, 1996 and March 31, 2003 were filed. In addition to PAN (AAAAR1259B), RSSDI was given TAN (HYDR01683D RANGE-14) for TDS and tax claims.
- g. **Life membership of RSSDI is increased to Rs. 2500 w.e.f. January 1, 2004**
- h. Following are guidelines for recording proceedings of RSSDI meetings in future:

“All academic proceedings at the annual conference of the RSSDI are the intellectual property of the RSSDI. The papers read or Orations delivered have to be preceded by submission of the manuscript in hard copy (two copies) and in floppy/CD Rom to the Chairman, Scientific Committee. Failure to do so shall make the speaker ineligible for delivery of the lecture.

All academic papers so collected will be reviewed by the Editor, International Journal of Diabetes in Developing Countries (IJDDC) for preferential publication in IJDDC, if found suitable. This shall be published in one of the regular issues or a special issue of IJDDC. Authors of articles not found suitable for publication will be informed within two months of completion of the conference and will be at liberty to publish them elsewhere.

If the proceedings are recorded (e.g. in a CD Rom) or abstracted for distribution, these cannot be released till the conference issue of the IJDDC is published and distributed.

The Organizing committee of the conference has no rights on the academic proceedings and are not authorized to publish them elsewhere.”

**ELECTION OF THE RSSDI
PRESIDENT FOR THE
YEAR 2004**

The tenure of the President shall be one RSSDI year (2.5.2 item i), and (2.5.3) to get elected as the President, a candidate should have held an elected position in the EC for three years. (3.1). Only one nomination was received from Prof. R.V. Jayakumar from among the eligible members for the post of the President duly proposed by a valid member and seconded by a valid member accompanied by his consent and bio-data by the Secretary before September 15, 2003.
